**Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Chaudhary Harchand Singh Atmaram Education Trust, Quadra Institute of Ayurveda, NH-58, Haridwar Road, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand (AYU0320) with intake capacity 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats and (ii) Shalya tantra-05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Renewal of Permission with intake capacity of 10 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 -reg.**

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Chaudhary Harchand Singh Atmaram Education Trust, Quadra Institute of Ayurveda, NH-58, Haridwar Road Roorke, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand (AYU0320)** inspection was conducted on **15.04.2025 & 16.04.2025** in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats and (ii) Shalya tantra-05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Renewal of Permission with intake capacity of 10 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Rachana Sharir-05 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024 provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

**1. Teaching staffs:-**

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college  
is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.67\%$  (Excluding Excess).

- 3) Accordingly, a clarification letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 26.05.2025 in respect of the aforementioned shortcomings/defects found during assessment. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification **vide an email dated 28.05.2025** enclosing a letter **vide QIA/QA/279/2025/376 dated 28.05.2025** and the submitted clarification is examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after **verification observation is as under:-**

**1. Teaching staffs:-**

**3. Animal House is not available:-** College clarified that we already collaborated with DIT University Dehradun for the Animal house facility for research work and also filled at the time of part 01 submission. Submission may be considered.

- 4) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined once again in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **127<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **20.06.2025** and **Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of intake capacity 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats and (ii) Shalya tantra-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Renewal of Permission with intake capacity of 10 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**

**"DECISION"**

- 5) **Therefore, Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Chaudhary Harchand Singh Atmaram Education Trust, Quadra Institute of Ayurveda, NH-58, Haridwar Road Roorke, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand (AYU0320) in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats and (ii) Shalya tantra-05 seats in accordance with Regulation 15(7) of MESAR PG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Renewal of Permission with intake capacity of 10 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-**
- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 21 seats in 04 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the permission Process for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024

v) The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 3 above, shall be fulfilled.

10) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
